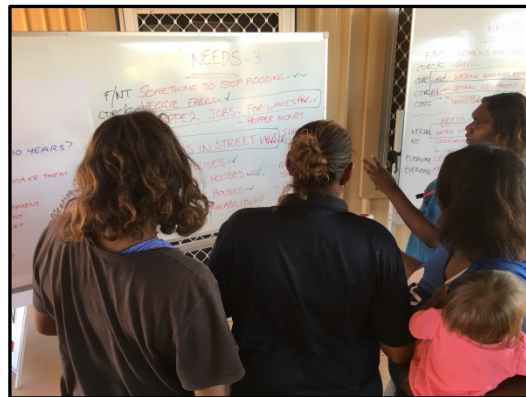

The community has a store, aged and disability facility, childcare, school, Centrelink office, post office, church, airstrip and a health clinic. The languages spoken in Laramba are Warlpiri and Anmatjere.
